Mrs Cracknell's Message

Thank you to our P&C for hosting their Pyjama Party last Thursday night. Our students had a wonderful evening while raising more funds for our P&C to support our school and students. This past week, the P&C fully subsidised the World of Maths program for our students. This ensured that all students had the opportunity to attend and participate in this hands on mathematical experience. Thank you to Mrs Lawrence for her organisation of World of Maths and Mrs Dunn for ensuring all students had the necessary resources for the program.







While the Pyjama Party was a P&C run initiative, it was conducted on our school site. Unfortunately, there were a number of students who brought mobile phones to this event. Our digital devices policy was implemented two years ago due to the increasing demands of digital devices. While on school grounds, all digital devices must be turned off and in a bag.

For events such as the Pyjama Party, it is expected that families meet and greet their children onsite at the conclusion of the event. As such, parents and carers come to the hall to pick up their children. Mobile phones are not required at this event when the start and finish times are indicated on the note that is sent home. As a general rule, all children wait inside the hall until their parent or carer comes inside to pick them up. In the future, children will not leave the hall until a parent or carer picks them up from the hall. The *Kootingal Public School Digital Devices Policy* has been uploaded to the Sentral Parent Portal for your perusal.

Last week, I had a meeting with our Home School Liaison Officer, Ms Mel McGilchrist, in relation to our students' attendance. Student attendance is examined fortnightly during our Learning and Support Team. During this meeting, Ms McGilchrist raised concerns regarding the number of medical appointments during school hours. As a parent, I know how difficult it is to obtain a medical appointment outside school hours and, coupled with this, the transportation from Kootingal to Tamworth adds additional time. Nevertheless, taking a whole day for a medical appointment in town is not necessary and won't be granted a full day of leave in the future. A medical certificate will be required to confirm the appointment and necessary treatment.

Kootingal Public School has a range of methods in which parents and carers are able to explain the absence of their child. These include:

- Via the Sentral Parent Portal.
- Phone call to the school on 67603332.

- A note when the student returns to school from the absence
- Replying to the daily absence text message sent from the school. Kootingal Public School has a dedicated SMS number so you can be assured it is coming from the school and you are able to save it to your phone.
- Facebook inbox. This is only seen by myself and Mrs Chegwyn.
- Text the school mobile phone.

Some parents have raised concerns in regards to ambulance calls made by the school. Each public school student in NSW is covered for ambulance care through the NSW Ambulance School and Group Cover Scheme. This scheme, managed by the NSW Ambulance Service, provides assurance that any student enrolled at a NSW public school, who has an accident or falls ill whilst at school or on an organised school excursion or activity, and requires the ambulance service, will have this cost met through the scheme. For the 2022 school year, coverage of the scheme includes cross-border excursions to the Australian Capital Territory and Victoria. At Kootingal Public School we are assured knowing this policy support the school and students and we don't hesitate to make the call for an ambulance. When the family receives the invoice from NSW Ambulance, it is simply returned to the school for payment by the Department.

As a timely reminder, we must take care of each other by still adhering to the mandates set out by NSW Health in relation to COVID-19. One area that requires attention at Kootingal Public School is when children are a household contact (someone who lives with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19) and close contact (someone who has been formally notified by NSW Health that they are a close contact).

Household and close contacts attending school will need to adhere to the following in addition to the NSW Health guidelines:

- They must notify the school and/or early childhood education (ECE) service provider (including their outside of school hours care provider) if they are intending to return under this provision. Schools will maintain this record on their local management systems. The student or staff member's name, SRN or ID numbers, class and date of intended return is captured.
- They should conduct a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 school days.
- They (if in a secondary school setting) must wear a mask indoors except when eating or exercising. Primary school students are recommended to wear a mask indoors (except when eating or exercising).
- No student or staff member identified as a household or close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps.

Mrs Cracknell's Message

- No apprentices, trainees or students on placement or staff member identified as a household or close contact will be permitted to attend settings identified as high risk by NSW Health (healthcare, aged care, disability care or correctional facilities)
- Any visitor to a school site who is a household or close contact is required to advise the school that they are a household or close contact before they come on site. These visitors should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times. Schools should consider if the visit can be conducted virtually.

If your child is a close contact or household contact, please notify the school immediately so we can support your child. We must look after each other.




